About the topic

In the decades in which broadcasting was carried out on a large scale on long, medium and short wave, transmitter sites were created whose names themselves became synonymous with broadcasting. These included Königs Wusterhausen in Germany and Hörby in Sweden. Radio transmitters on medium and short wave were in operation near the small town of Hörby in southern Sweden for several decades.

Other examples of world-famous broadcasting locations were Allouis in France, Beromünster in Switzerland, Brasov in Romania, Droitwich in the UK, Kalundborg in Denmark and Liblice in the Czech Republic.

In radio broadcasting at that time, each station had to hold its own assigned frequency and had to cover a large area, which in many cases extended far beyond national borders.

About the book

This book tells the story of a large medium wave transmitter and three generations of powerful short wave transmitters in Hörby. One episode is the transfer of the medium-wave transmitter's output stage to the Funkerberg Museum in Königs Wusterhausen.

Many of the photos and newspaper texts shown here are provided by archives of the operating company Teracom AB. Some of them now are published for the first time.

In addition to the German edition, an English-language edition was published in response to international interest.

Gerhard Roleder studied physics and electronic components at Ilmenau Technical University from 1975 to 1979. From 1979 to 1989, he worked as a technologist and development engineer at the microelectronics companies in Ilmenau and Erfurt.
